To the Honorable, The City Council of the City of Chicago:

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN--I return an ordinance passed September 28, 1983 adding a new Chapter 6.1 to the Municipal Code of the City of Chicago. I disapprove the ordinance.

As a threshold matter, I wish to make clear my belief that the objective of the ordinance, to establish a more open system of budget consideration, is one of which I heartily approve and enthusiastically support. There are, however, certain minor areas of disagreement which I wish to bring to your attention.

Because this ordinance concerns budget procedures, prudent strategy in effecting any alterations from the statutory procedure requires that all efforts be taken to minimize the possibility of ambiguity and confusion. Section 15 of the ordinance permits amendment of the annual appropriation ordinance "at any subsequent meeting of the City Council". I am concerned that this provision would inhibit the sale of tax anticipation notes, where the appropriation ordinance upon which the notes are issued may so casually be amended.

I am also concerned that by going beyond departmental budgets, to appropriations for organizational units of departments, as does Section 2 of the ordinance, I believe it deprives the executive branch of our government of the breathing space necessary for effective administration. It is important that the executive branch be permitted to make organizational changes within departments with some freedom, rather than to bind each department in a budgetary straightjacket.

Finally, I am disturbed with the two provisions arbitrarily tacked on to the budget ordinance, namely, those concerning contract approval and campaign contributions. Whatever the merits of these respective provisions, they bear no relationship to the rest of the ordinance. A provision dealing with campaign contributions would plainly be a healthful reform. One is pending before the Committee on Finance and I recommend your consideration of that measure as an amendment to Chapter 26 of the Municipal Code. The provision dealing with contracts seems superfluous since it has been my policy to seek your approval for any significant contract as, for example, the contract dealing with ChicagoFest. In addition, to mandate resort to council for every \$5,000.00 personal service contract would make government totally unworkable.

Accordingly, pursuant to statute, I veto the ordinance as submitted.

PART I AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this day of , by the City of Chicago, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City" and the Chicago Transit Authority, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Authority".

WHEREAS, the City proposes to renovate Dearborn Street subway facilities, including: (1) access facilities between street and mezzanines at Randolph/ Washington, Washington/Madison and Adams/Jackson; (2) mezzanine fare control areas at Washington/Madison and Adams/Jackson, both of which are located beneath Dearborn Street; (3) a pedestrian passageway linking mezzanines on the State and Dearborn subways at Adams/Jackson; and (4) access facilities between mezzanines at Washington/Madison and Adams/Jackson and the continuous platform below, all of which shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 1981 and June 14, 1981, the City of Chicago was awarded grants from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (IL-23-9012) and from the Illinois Department of Transportation (CAP-81-176-IST), respectively, for financial assistance in the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, by ordinance passed May 13, 1981, the City Council authorized the execution of grant contracts with the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation for construction of the Project, in the following amounts:

UMTA (IL-23-9012)	\$ 888,250
IDOT (CAP-81-176-IST)	134,250

TOTAL \$1,045,000; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 1982 and on October 25, 1982, the City of Chicago was awarded grant amendments from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (IL-23-9012-01) and from the Illinois Department of Transportation (CAP-81-176-IST, Amendment #1), respectively, for further financial assistance in the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, by ordinance passed February 10, 1982, the City Council authorized execution of grant contracts with the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation for further construction of the Project, in the following amounts:

UMTA (IL-23-9012-01)	\$3,187,500
IDOT (CAP-81-176-IST)	562,500
TOTAL	<u>\$3,750,000</u> ; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 1982 and on October 25, 1982, the City of Chicago was awarded additional grant amendments from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (IL-23-9012-02) and from the Illinois Department of Transportation (CAP-81-176-IST, Amendment #2), respectively, for further financial assistance in the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, by ordinance passed September 15, 1982, the City Council authorized the execution of grant contracts with the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation for construction of the Project, in the following amounts:

UMTA (IL-23-9012)	\$ 467,500
IDOT (CAP-81-176-IST)	82,500
TOTAL	<u>\$ 550,000</u> ; and

WHEREAS, the Project will conform to operating requirements as approved by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the City requires assistance in assuring compliance with the Authority's criteria and functional requirements during the design and construction of the Project and desires to avail itself of the engineering and force account capabilities of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has indicated its desire to cooperate in the implementation of said Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises of the Parties hereto, the Authority agrees to undertake the following:

1. Scope of Services. The Authority shall perform or cause to be performed in a satisfactory manner, as determined by the Commissioner of Public Works or his designated representative, the following services pertaining to this Project.

These services shall include the following:

- a. Provide engineering liaison as required for coordination of CTA force account work and contractors' work during subway renovation construction.

- b. Provide engineering for temporary relocation of signals as necessary for relocation of train berthing where required for patron safety during mezzanine construction.
- c. Provide force account work to assist Contractor's personnel in removal, relocation and installation of both existing and new fare controls and communication equipment during construction.

2. Cooperation. The Authority shall, during the time of this Agreement, cooperate with all City Agencies, Federal Agencies, State Agencies, utility companies and all other agencies working on other phases of the Project, so as not to interfere with or hinder the progress or completion of work.

3. Time of Services. The services of the Authority shall begin on receipt of notice to proceed and shall be completed by December 31, 1988, unless the time is extended by mutual agreement.

4. Basis of Payment. The City will pay the Authority for consulting and force account services performed under this Agreement on the following basis:

- a. For direct payroll costs plus () % percent of said direct payroll costs to cover the cost of fringe benefits.

This percentage shall be based on a certified audit of the AUTHORITY and is subject to change as new audits are conducted. As rate changes occur, payments shall be adjusted to the effective date of the new rate.

- b. For reimbursement of engineering and construction services performed by subcontractor under contract to the Authority at the actual cost of the said contract.
- c. Reimbursable Expenses
Reimbursement will be made for long distance telephone calls and for out-of-pocket costs relating to engineering and force account services, at actual cost, when accompanied by original copies of receipts or invoices, and when the work was requested by the City in performance of the scope of services.
- d. Compensation pursuant to subparagraph "a", "b" and "c" above is estimated to be as follows:

5. Method of Payment. The Authority shall submit to the City, once each month, an invoice on forms furnished by, and itemized as required by, the Department of Public Works, to correspond to Section 10 (Funds Chargeable). The invoice shall be for services completed during the invoice period. Upon approval by the Department of Public Works, the City will pay in full for costs contained in the invoice.

6. Termination for Convenience. The City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement at any time after date of Agreement, with or without cause, by giving the AUTHORITY in writing, a notice of termination. The notice shall be mailed certified to the AUTHORITY at its business address, and the effective date of termination shall be the date of receipt of the notice as shown on the certified mail return receipt. The City shall pay the AUTHORITY for the sums then due for acceptable services performed in accordance with this agreement contract and costs incurred in connection therewith up to the termination date.

7. Termination for Default. The City may at its sole discretion terminate this Agreement for default if the AUTHORITY fails to perform or comply with the terms of the Agreement. Notice of such termination will be mailed registered to the AUTHORITY at its business address. Upon receipt of a termination notice, the AUTHORITY has ten days in which all deliverables, prepared to date, shall be turned over to the City. The City shall pay the AUTHORITY for the sums then due for acceptable services performed and documented termination cost incurred.

8. Progress Reports. The AUTHORITY shall submit Monthly Reports to the City. These reports shall identify the work carried out during the previous month and the costs incurred. The AUTHORITY shall submit one monthly report for each Project location, as specified in Section 10 below.

9. Notice. Notice as provided for herein shall be transmitted to the Commissioner of Public Works, Room 406, City Hall, Chicago, Illinois 60602, and to the AUTHORITY by first-class prepaid mail addressed to Chicago Transit Authority, P.O. Box 3555, Merchandise Mart Plaza, Chicago, Illinois 60654.

10. Funds Chargeable. Payment will be made from the following fund numbers:

Fund Number 085-6606-802

Support Engineering during construction and force account work at Washington/Madison

Fund Number 085-6606-803

Support Engineering during construction and force account work at Adams/Jackson

11. Financial Assistance. This Agreement is subject to financial assistance contracts between the City of Chicago and the Urban Mass Transportation Administration of the U.S. Department of Transportation and between the City of Chicago and the Illinois Department of Transportation.

12. Audit and Inspection of Records. The Authority shall permit the authorized representatives of the City, the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Illinois Department of Transportation, and the Comptroller General of the United States to inspect and audit all data and records of the Authority relating to work done under this Agreement. The AUTHORITY shall make these records available at reasonable times during the Agreement period and for at least three (3) years from the date of final payment of federal funds to the City.

13. Assignment. This Agreement or any portion thereof, shall not be assigned by the AUTHORITY without the prior written consent of the City.

14. Retention of Records. The contractor shall maintain records to show actual time devoted and costs incurred.

15. Ownership of Records. The City shall retain ownership of all plans, specifications, and related comments.

16. Subcontracts. The AUTHORITY shall not enter into any subcontract or agreements, or start any work by the work forces of the AUTHORITY or use any materials from the stores of the AUTHORITY, with respect to this Agreement, without the prior concurrence of UMTA and IDOT. The AUTHORITY shall cooperate with the City in providing all information necessary to enable the City to make required submittals to UMTA and IDOT.

17. Equal Employment Opportunity. In connection with the execution of this Agreement, the Authority shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, or national origin. The Authority shall take affirmative actions to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, religion, color, sex or national origin. Such actions shall include: but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment, or recruitment advertising; lay-off, or termination; rates of pay, or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

18. Interest of Public Officials. No member, officer, or employee of the Public Body or of a local public body during his tenure or for one year thereafter shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.

19. Interest of Members of Congress. No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefits arising therefrom.

20. Minority Business Enterprise. In connection with the performance of this Agreement, the Authority will provide for the maximum utilization of minority business enterprises and will use its best efforts to insure that minority business enterprises shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for contract and subcontract work under this Agreement. The Authority assures that MBE goals shall be applicable to this project, all in accordance with the guidelines of 49 C.F.P., Part 23 and the MBE participation procedures and goals as set forth in the Authority's Minority Business Enterprise Program approved by the U.S. Department of Transportation.

PART I AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this day of , by the City of Chicago, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City" and the Chicago Transit Authority, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Authority".

- d. Review contract documents that will be presented to the Authority when they are 33 percent complete, 66 percent complete and 95 percent complete.
- e. Review shop drawings relating to agents' booths, electrical systems and any other Project components that may require special attention.
- f. Provide signal design services during design and construction phases for the relocation of train berthings, where required for patron safety.
- g. Provide engineering liaison as required for field coordination of CTA force account work and/or contractors' work during subway renovation construction.

- h. Provide force account work to relocate signals and signs if required to accommodate construction staging of boarding areas and subway tubes.
- i. Provide force account work to assist Contractor's personnel in removal, relocation and installation of both existing and new fare controls and communication equipment during construction.

3. Time of Services. The services of the Authority shall begin on receipt of notice to proceed and shall be completed by December 31, 1988, unless the time is extended by mutual agreement.

4. Basis of Payment. The City will pay the Authority for consulting and force account services performed under this Agreement on the following basis:

5. Method of Payment. The Authority shall submit to the City, once each month, an invoice on forms furnished by, and itemized as required by, the Department of Public Works, to correspond to Section 10 (Funds Chargeable). (7) That it will include verbatim or by reference the provisions of this clause in every subcontract it awards under which any portion of the contract obligations are undertaken or assumed, so that such provisions will be binding upon such subcontractor. In the same manner as with other provisions of this contract, the contractor will be liable for compliance with applicable provisions of this clause by such subcontractors; and further it will promptly notify the contracting agency and the Department in the event any subcontractor fails or refuses to comply therewith. In addition, no contractor will utilize any subcontractor declared by the Illinois Human Rights Commission to be ineligible for contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporation..

22. Carrier Agreement. This Agreement is a Carrier Agreement, as defined in the Illinois Department of Transportation Public Transportation Capital Improvement Grant Manual, dated September, 1982, and is subject to Department review and concurrence procedures applicable to such agreements, including the applicability of third-party contract requirements to subcontracts of the AUTHORITY.

23. Terms and Conditions. This Agreement incorporates and is subject to the provisions attached hereto as Part II, Contract for Professional Consultant Services, General Conditions, with the following modifications:

A. Sub-paragraph "D" on "Professional Liability Insurance" is deleted.

B. The following paragraph will be added:

"This is to certify that the Chicago Transit Authority is self-insured and that subject to the receipt of financial assistance from the RTA in accordance with Chicago Transit Authority budgeted estimate, has funds available in amounts as set forth in accordance with the insurance requirements. The Chicago Transit Authority is self-insured for the first \$2,500,000.00 and carries excess Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance for the next \$20,000,000.00."

24. Payment for Changes (Amendments). If modifications to the Scope of Services resulting from changes made in accordance with the provisions set forth under "Changes" in Part II, General Conditions, cause an increase or decrease in the Authority's cost of, or time required for, performance of the Agreement, an equitable adjustment shall be made and the Agreement amended, with the prior approval of funding agencies as appropriate. The City will pay for these additional services by amending the budgets assigned to tasks in Section 4.d above.

Traffic Regulations (Suspension System).**

27-350.1 Suspension system. (a) It shall be unlawful to operate a motor vehicle on any street of this City when the suspension system has been modified from the original manufactured design by lifting the body from the chassis in excess of 3 inches or to cause the horizontal line from the front to the rear bumper to vary over 3 inches in height when measured from a level surface of the highway to the lower edge of the bumper.

(b) Nothing in this section shall prevent the installation of manufactured heavy duty equipment to include shock absorbers and overload springs, nor shall anything contained in this section prevent a person to operate a motor vehicle on any street of this City with normal wear of the suspension system if normal wear does not affect the control or safe operation of the vehicle. This section shall not apply to motor vehicles designed or modified primarily for off-highway racing purposes while such vehicles are in tow or to motorcycles or motor driven cycles.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its date of passage.

The bumper height shall not be modified to vary more than 3 inches from the original manufactured bumper height for that vehicle when measured from a level surface of the highway to the lower edge of the bumper. Nothing in this section shall prevent the installation of manufactured bumper guards.

(b) This section shall not apply to motor vehicles designed or modified primarily for off-highway racing purposes while such vehicle is in tow or to motorcycles or motor driven cycles, nor to an antique vehicle, when registered as such, when the original design did not include bumpers.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its date of passage.

SECTION 1. *It shall be unlawful to place any outdoor advertising sign or display within a residence district classified as single family residence districts R1 and R2, and general residence district R3, as defined in Chapter 194A of Municipal Code of Chicago titled Chicago Zoning Ordinance.*

SECTION 2. *Any person or persons who shall cause such outdoor sign or display to be placed in such areas shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 per day for each day that said outdoor sign or display shall be allowed on said residence property.*

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.

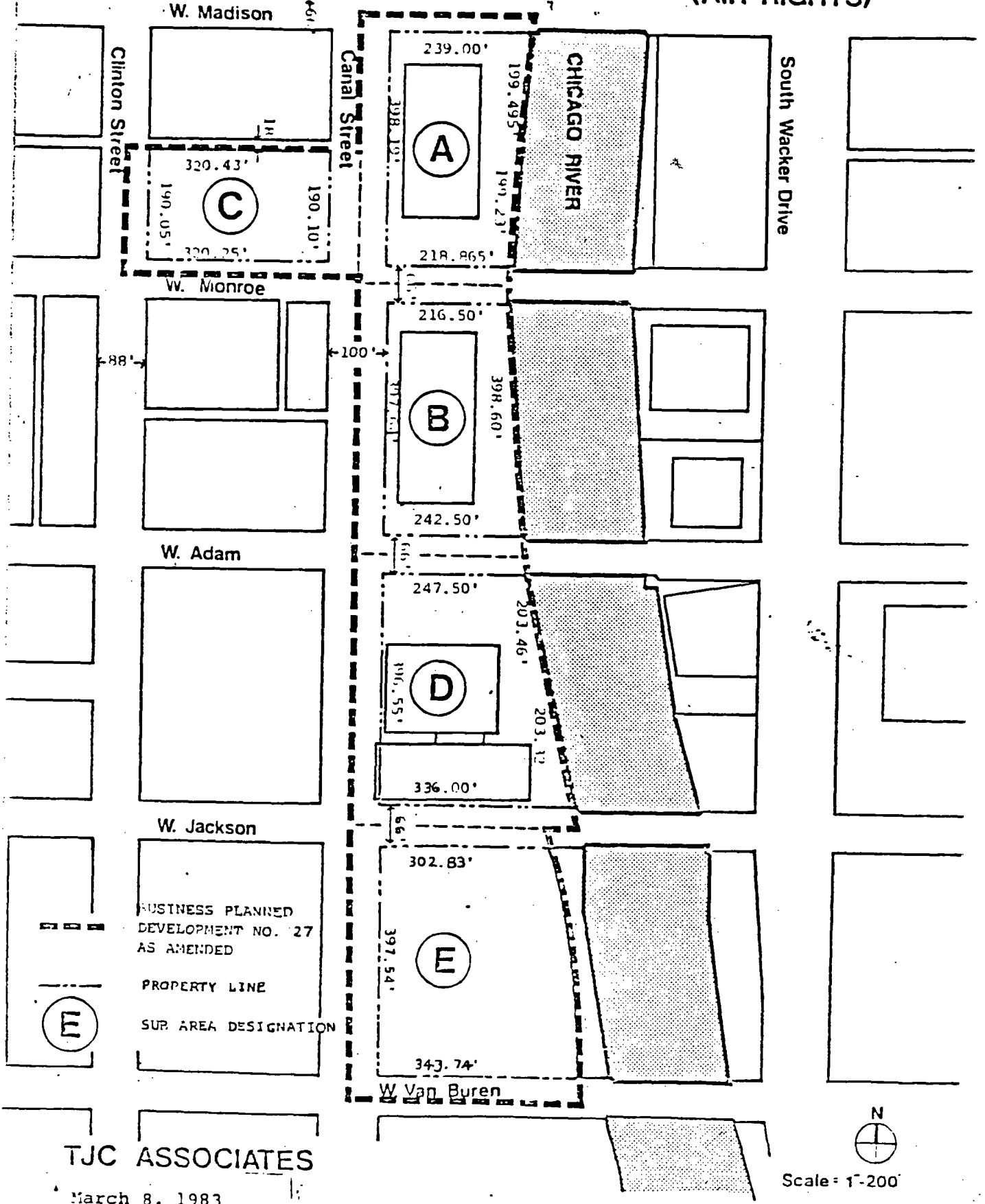

PROPERTY LINE MAP

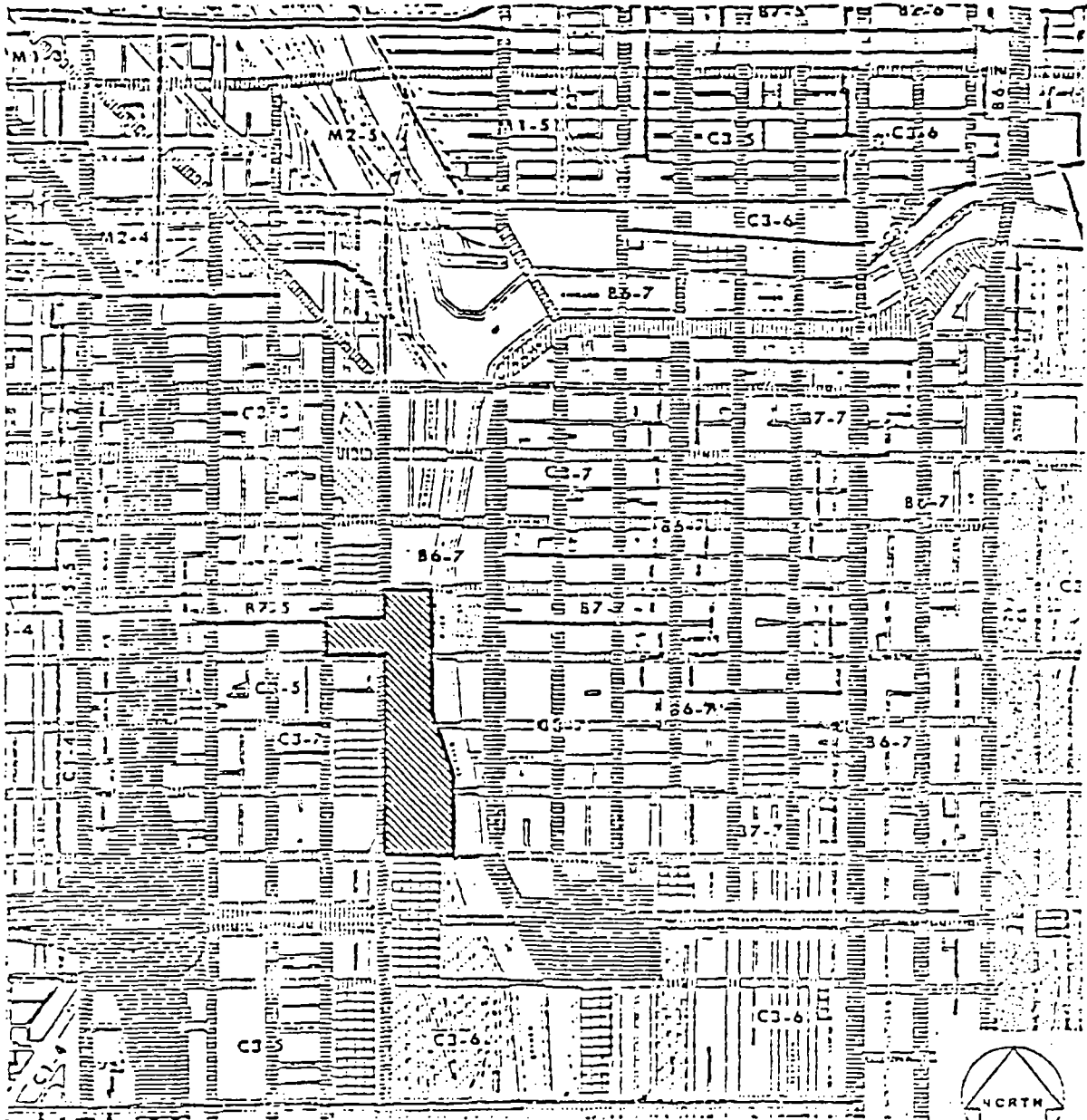

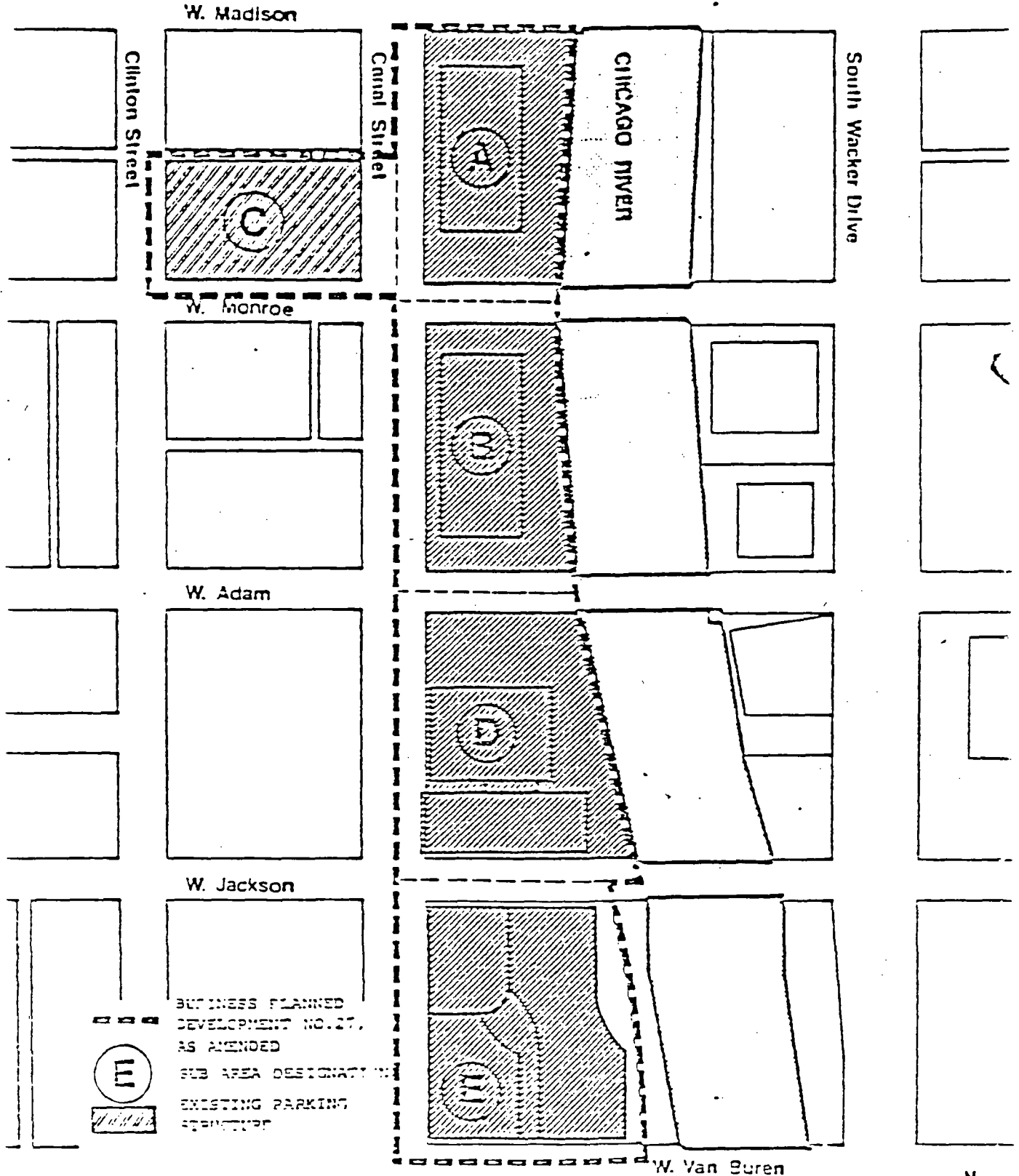



GENERALIZED LAND USE PLAN

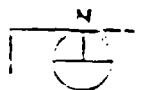

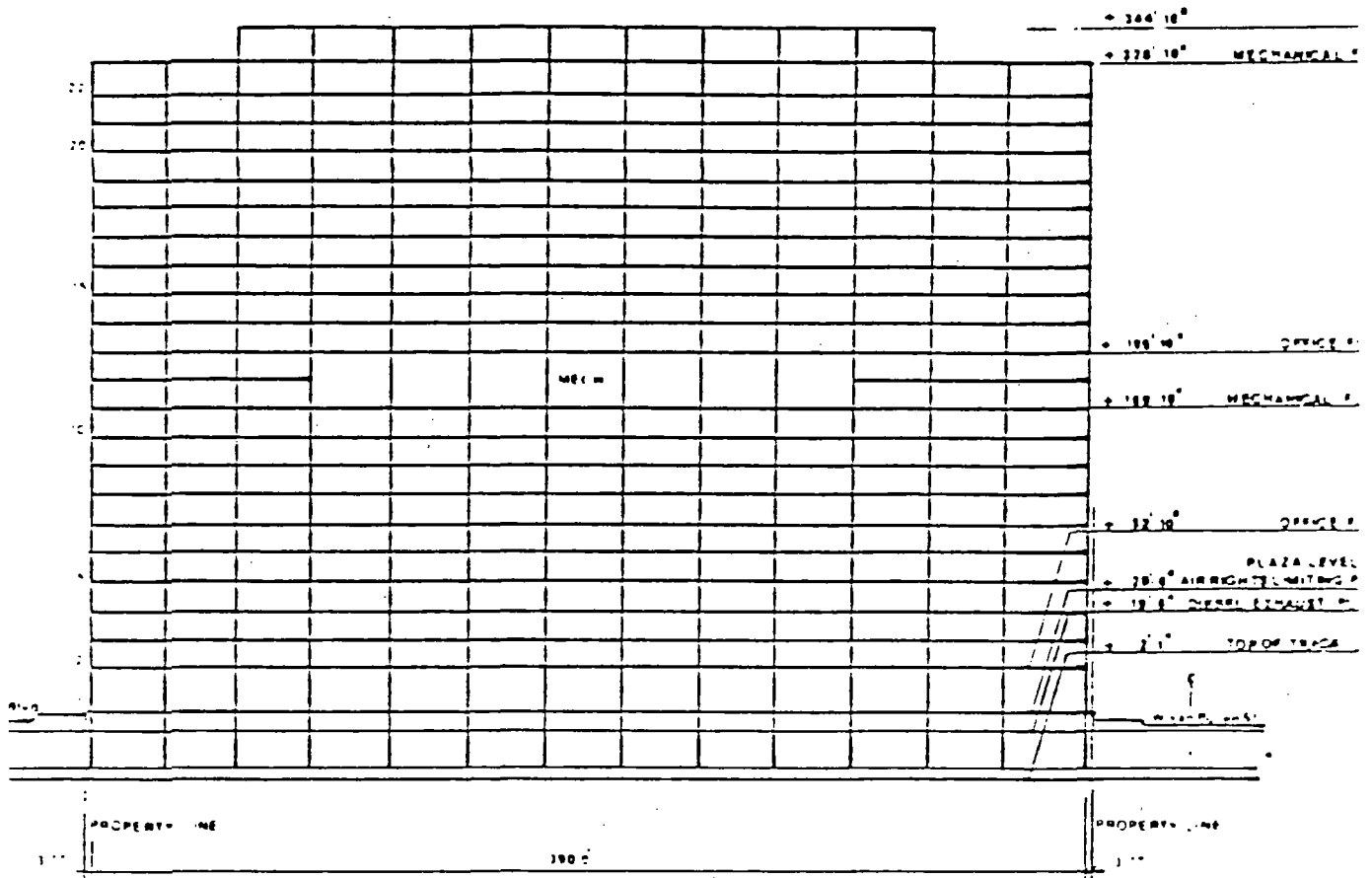

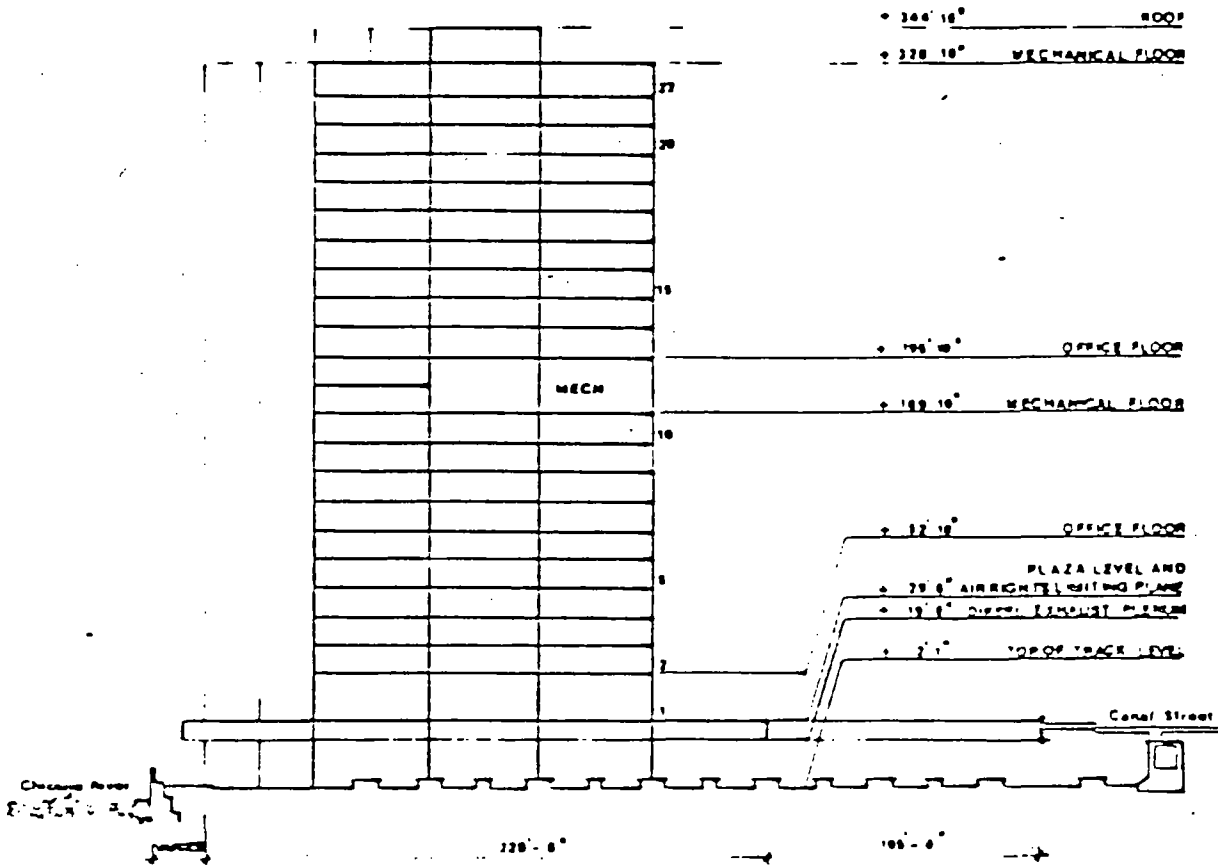

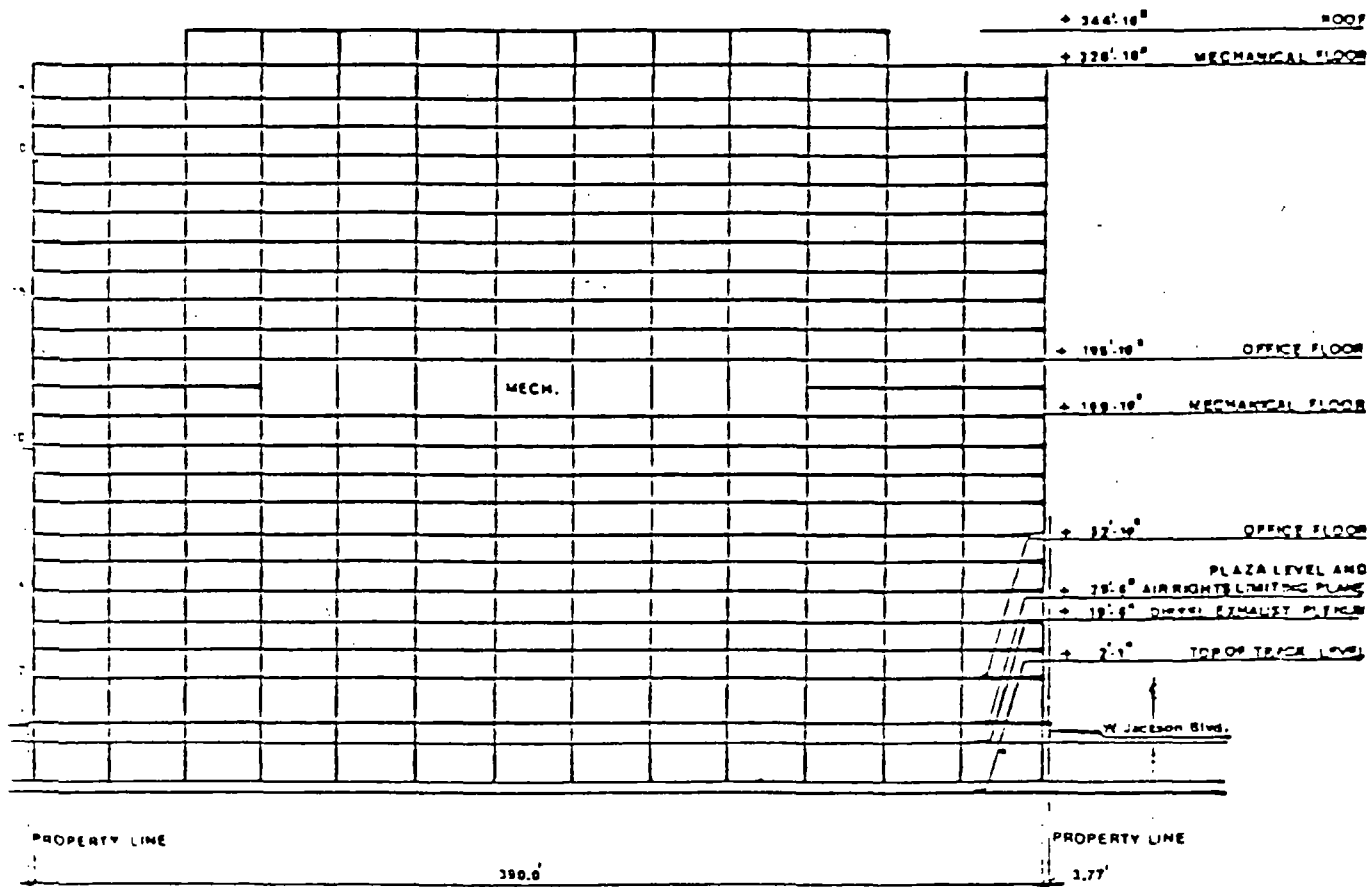

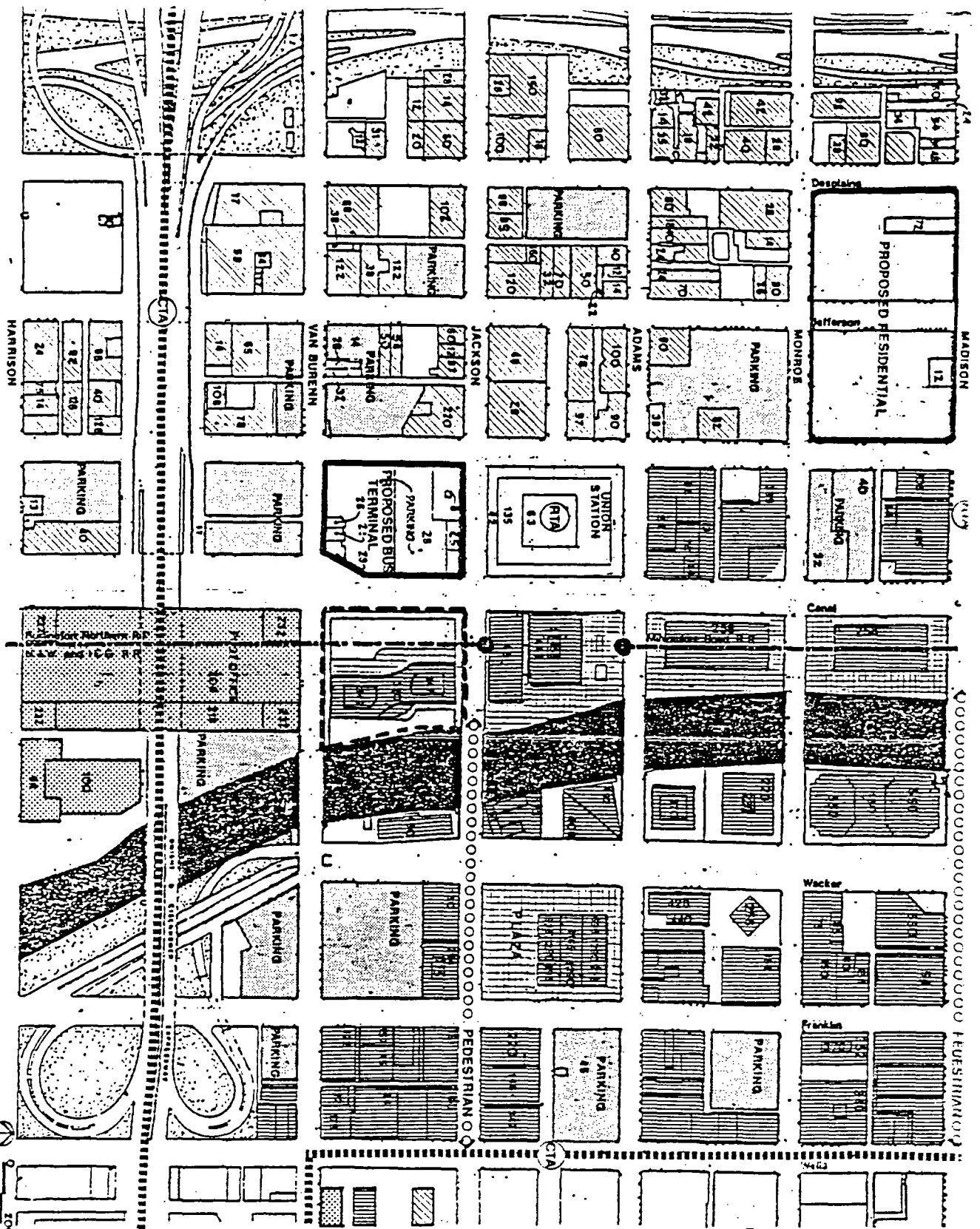
GATEWAY IV HELIPAD PROPOSAL

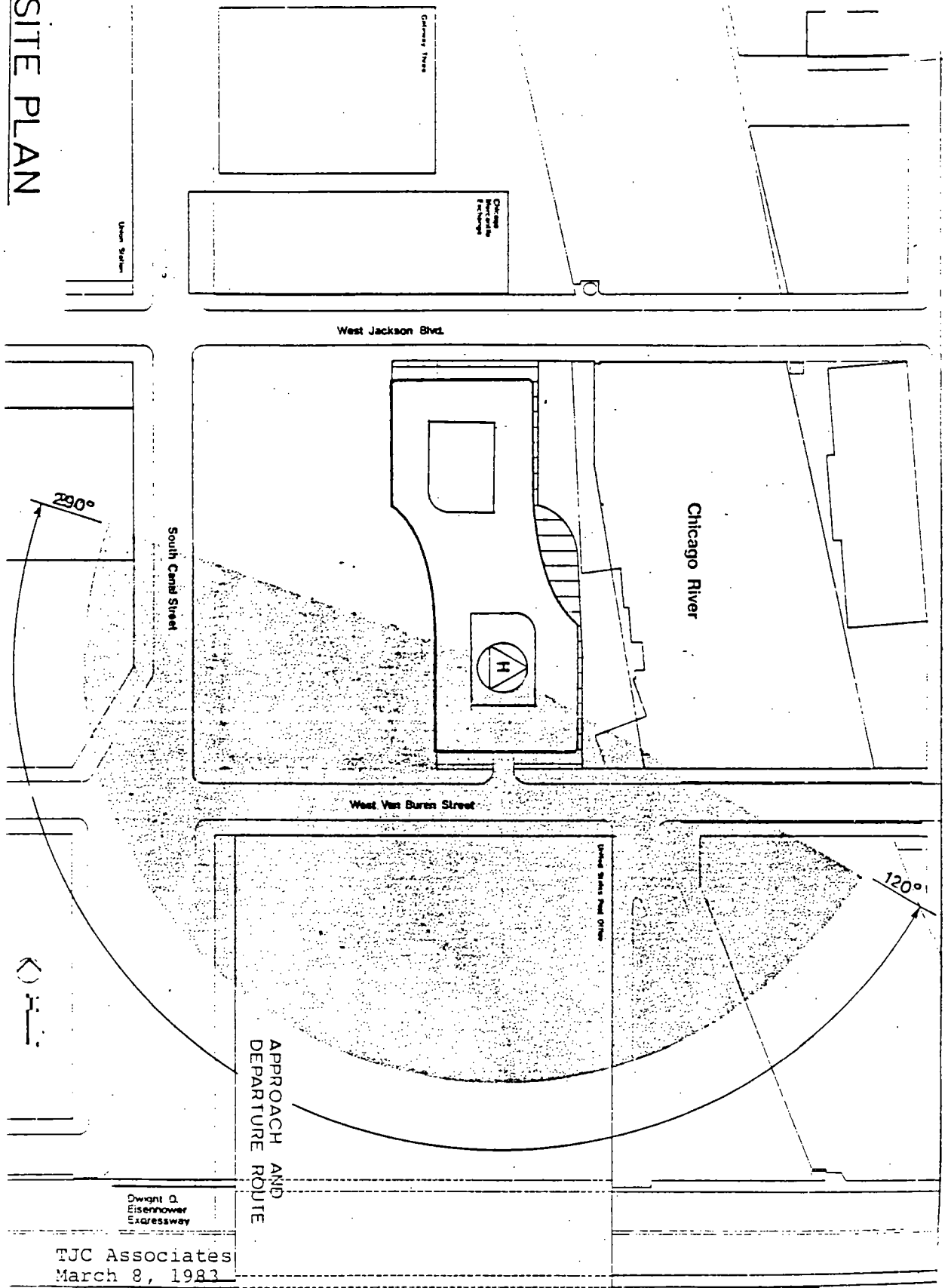

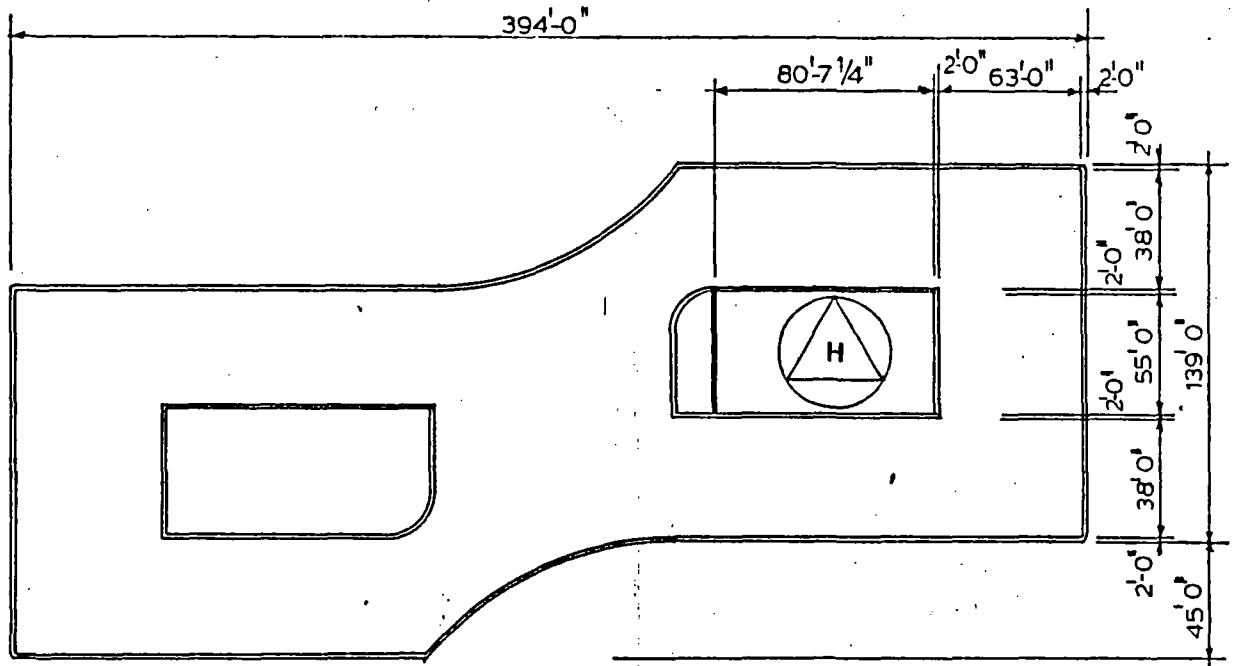

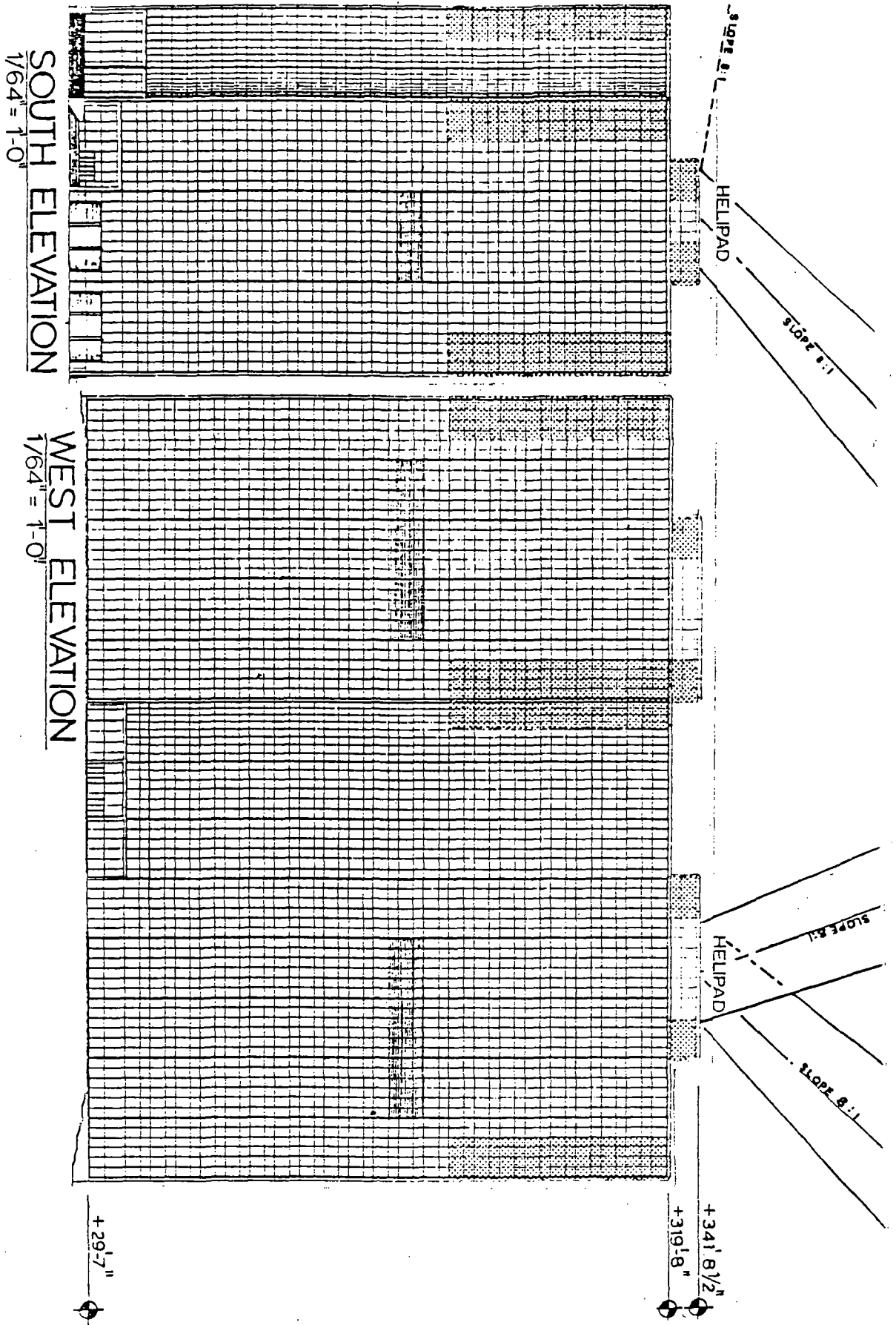


ROOF PLAN

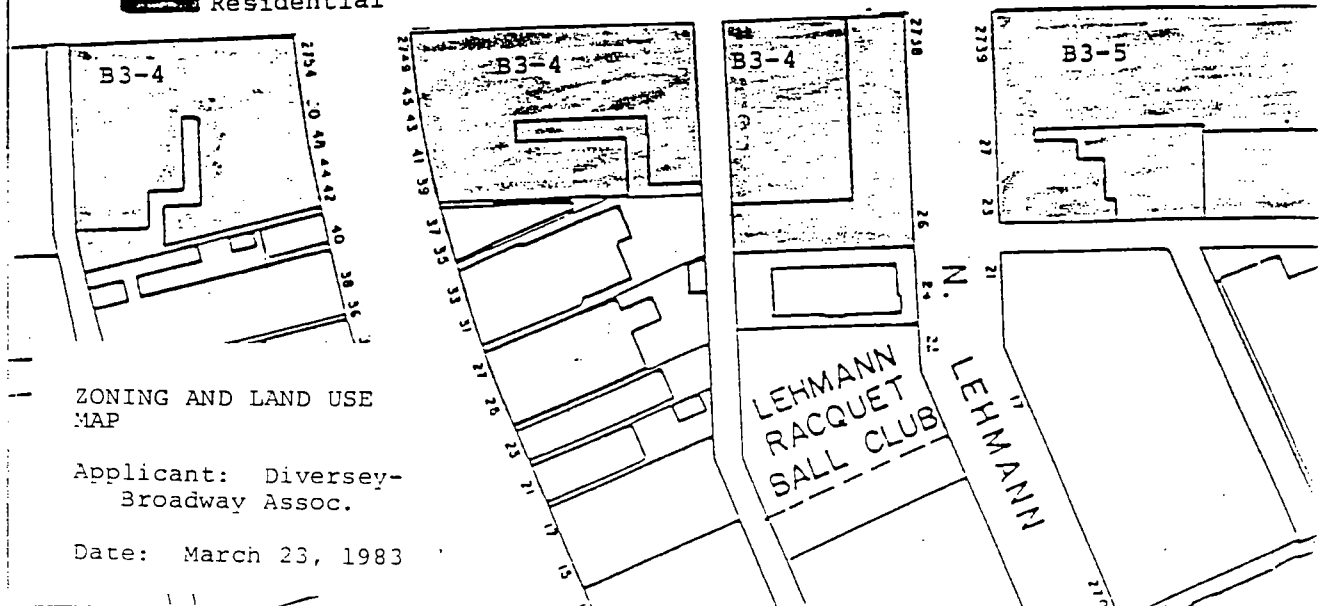

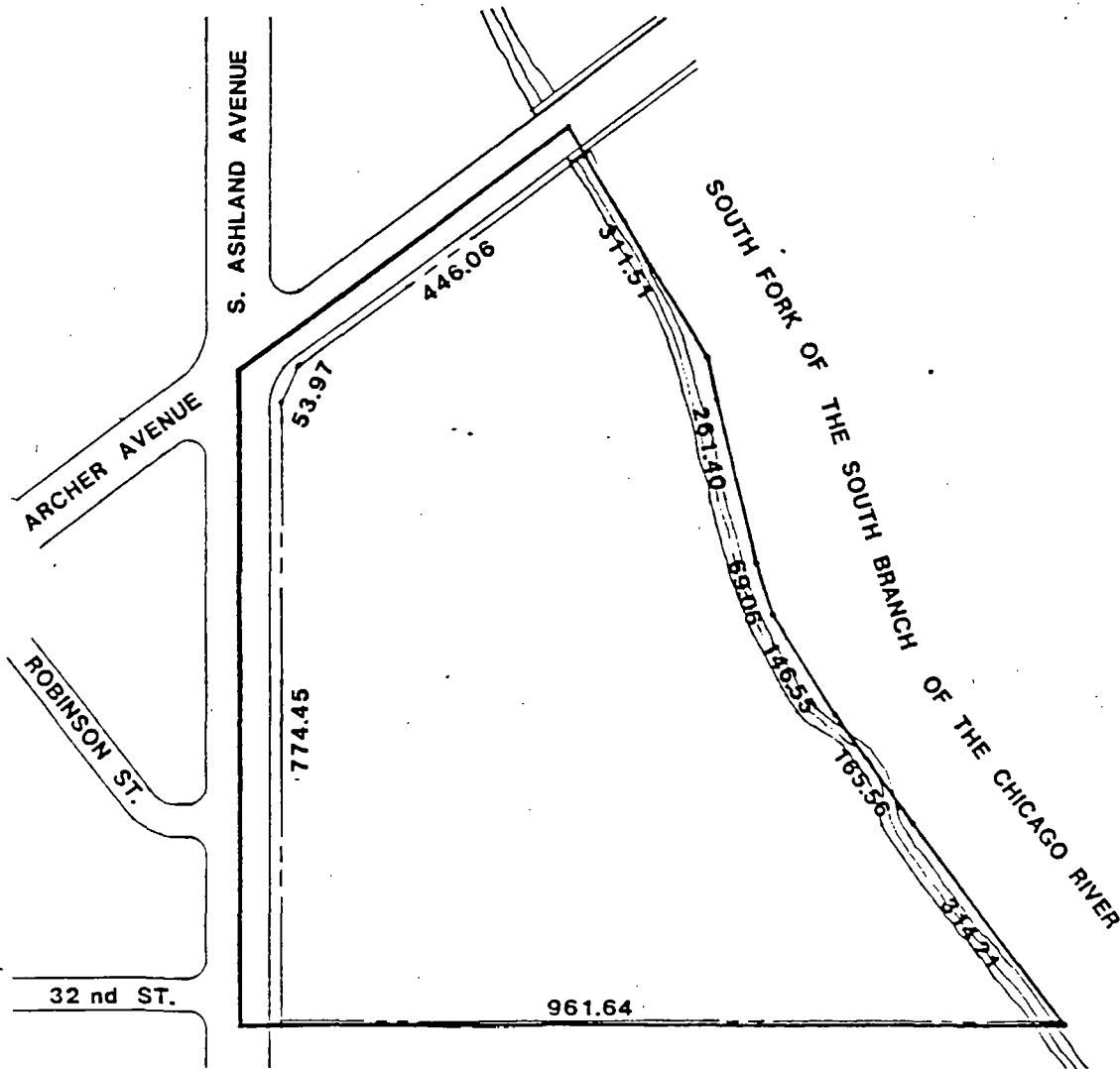

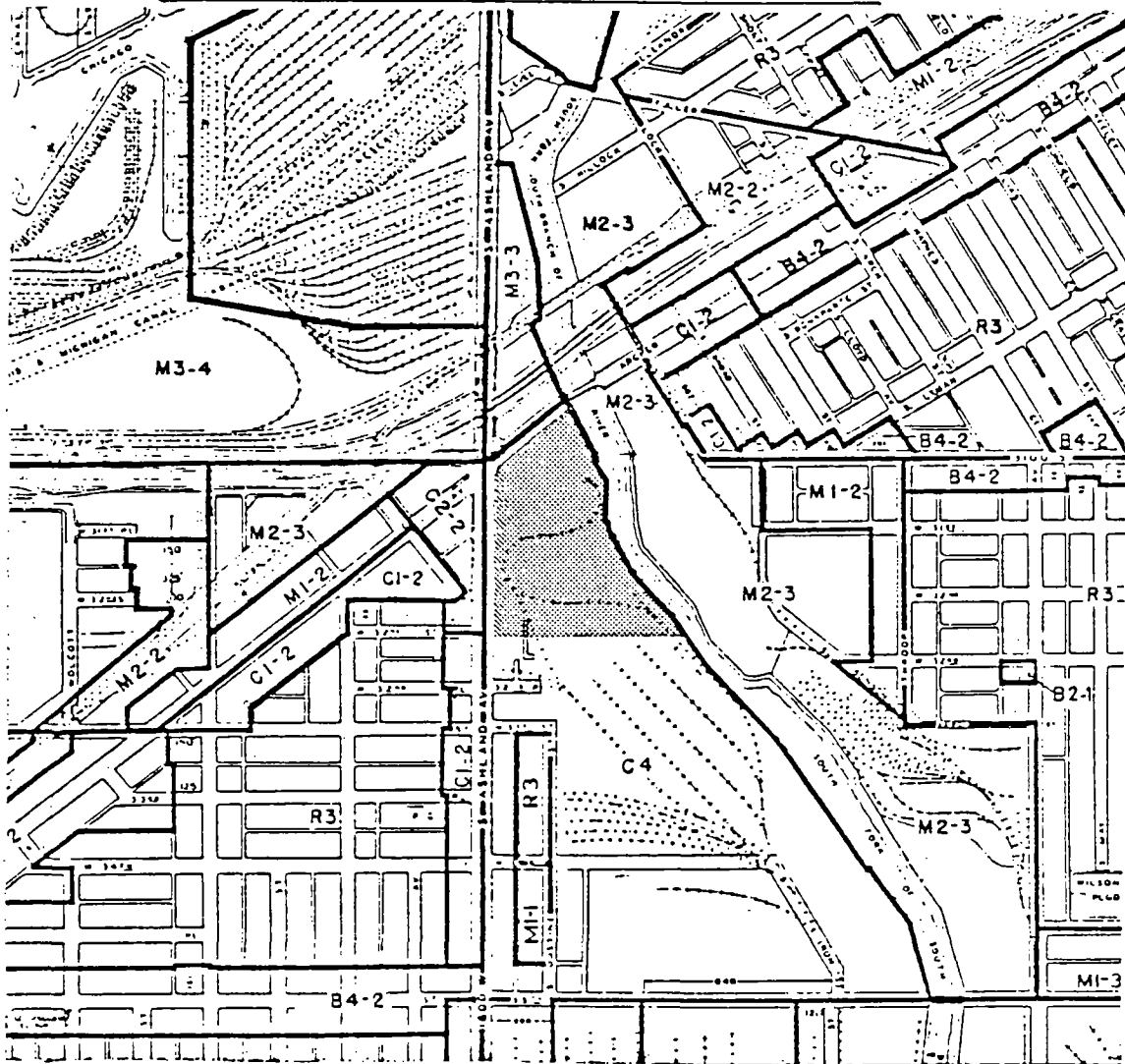

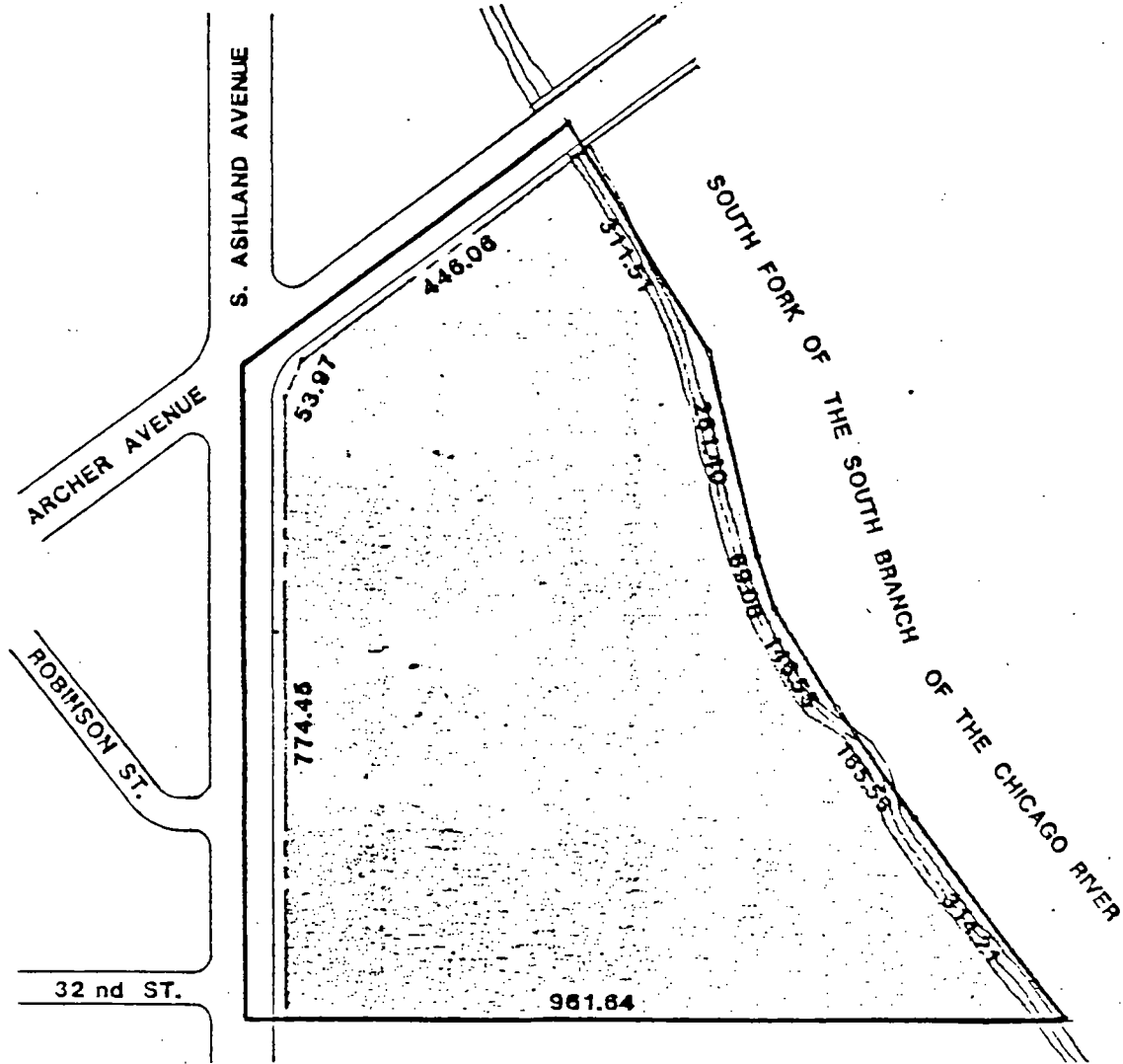

Chapter 36.1 Chicago Street Performance Ordinance

36.1-1 Definitions

The following terms are defined for the purpose of this Chapter as follows:

(a) "Perform" includes, but is not limited to the following activities: acting, singing, playing musical instruments, pantomime, juggling, magic, dancing and reciting.

(b) "Performer" means an individual who owns a permit issued pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.

(c) "Public Areas" includes sidewalks, parks, playgrounds, above-ground and underground transit platforms, and all other public ways located in the City of Chicago.

36.1-2 Prohibition

(a) No person may perform in a public area without having obtained a permit issued under Section 36.1-3 of this Chapter.

(b) Any person who performs in a public area without a permit issued under Section 36.1-3 of this Chapter shall be fined not more than \$25.

36.1-3 Permit

(a) A permit shall be issued by the Department of Revenue to each applicant therefor in exchange for a completed application and a fee of \$10 subject to the provisions of Section 36.1-8 of this Chapter.

(b) A completed application for a permit shall contain the applicant's name, address and telephone number and shall be signed by the applicant.

(c) A permit shall be valid from the date on which it is issued through December 31 of the year in which it is issued.

(d) A permit shall contain the name and permit number of the applicant plus the year in which the permit is valid.

(e) A permit shall be non-transferable.

(f) Upon issuing a permit the Department of Revenue shall also issue to the performer a printed copy of this Chapter.

36.1-4 Display of Permit

A performer shall carry a permit on his or her person while performing and shall display said permit or card on his or her person during said performance.

36.1-5 Permitted Performance

(a) Performances may take place in the following locations:

In public areas, except those excluded by the City Council or the Superintendent of Police pursuant to Section 36.1-7 of this Chapter:

On private property if the performer has obtained written permission of the owner of such property or other person with authority to grant such permission with respect to such property; and

In a public area where an authorized fair or public festival is being conducted, if the performer has obtained the written permission of the sponsor of such fair or festival.

(b) A performance may take place at any time on a transit platform if said performance is not audible at any residence; otherwise, performances may take place at the following times:

Between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M. on Mondays through Thursdays:

Between the hours of 8:00 A.M. Fridays and 11 P.M. on Fridays:

Between the hours of 9:00 A.M. Saturdays and 11 P.M. on Saturdays:

Between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M. on Sundays.

(c) A performer may not use electric or electronic amplification except by special permit issued by order of the City Council of the City of Chicago.

(d) A performer may not block the passage of the public through a public area except as permitted by the sponsor of an event under paragraph (a) of this Section or otherwise allowed by the Commissioner of the Department of Streets and Sanitation. If a sufficient crowd gathers to see or hear a performer such that the passage of the public through a public area is blocked, a police officer may disperse the portion of the crowd that is blocking the passage of the public, but said police officer shall not cause the performer to leave the location.

(e) No performer or group of performers shall perform at a distance of less than 100 feet from another performer or group of performers that already is performing.

36.1-6 Legal Conduct

(a) A performer may accept contributions of money or property at a performance, provided that no sign requesting contributions shall exceed 12" x 18" in size. Contributions may be received in any receptable.

(b) A performer who performs and accepts contributions under the provisions of this Chapter shall not be committing disorderly conduct under Section 193-1 of the Municipal Code of Chicago by virtue of those acts.

36.1-7 Exclusion of Public Areas

(a) A public area may be excluded from performances

By majority decision of the City Council,

or

By decision of the Superintendent of Police in the case of an emergency; provided that no public area may be excluded from performances by the Superintendent of Police under this subparagraph for more than 7 days.

36.1-8 Revocation of Permit

(a) The Department of Revenue may suspend a permit for not more than 30 days if any information contained in the application thereof is found to be false.

(b) The Department of Revenue may suspend a permit for not more than 60 days or revoke a permit if a performer violates any of the provisions of this Chapter.

(c) After revocation of a permit, the former performer may not obtain a new permit until such date as the Department of Revenue may determine, provided that such date shall not be more than one year after the date of revocation.

(d) No permit may be suspended or revoked unless the Department of Revenue holds a public hearing concerning that suspension or revocation, written notice of which has been given to the performer not less than 7 days prior to said public hearing. Such notice shall set forth the facts constituting the basis for the proposed suspension or revocation.

(e) Upon suspension or revocation of a permit, a performer may appeal the decision of the Department of Revenue before the Mayor's License Commission which shall have the power to reverse or modify the decision of the Department of Revenue, after holding a public hearing, in accordance with their rules and as presently promulgated.
