Chapter 98 and Chapter 167 of Municipal Code Amended Concerning
Ban of Unlicensed Possession of Animals for Slaughter and
Requiring Private Scavengers to Carry a Means for
Removal of Spilled Garbage.

The Committee on Energy and Environmental Protection submitted the following report:

To the President and Members of the City Council:

Your Committee on Energy and Environmental Protection, having had under consideration a communication from the Honorable Mayor Jane M. Byrne, under date of January 14, 1982, (which was referred to this Committee on January 14, 1982), requesting the passage of a proposed ordinance amending Chapter 98 of the Municipal Code of Chicago by adding a Section 98-11.1, banning the unlicensed possession of animals for slaughter, and having had under consideration a proposed ordinance, under date of April 21, 1982, (which was referred to this Committee on April 21, 1982), amending Chapter 167 of the Municipal Code of Chicago by adding a Section 167-5.1, requiring private scavengers to carry a means for removal of spilled garbage, begs leave to recommend that this Honorable Body *Pass*, said proposed ordinance amending Chapter 98 and said proposed ordinance amending Chapter 167.

Said ordinances, as passed, read respectively as follows (the *Italic* heading in each case not being a part of the ordinance):

Amendment of Chapter 98.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 98 of the Municipal Code of the City of Chicago is hereby amended by adding thereto, in proper sequential order, a new section in *Italics*, to be numbered Section 98-11.1 and to read as follows:

98-11.1. No person shall own, keep or otherwise possess, or slaughter any sheep, goat, pig, cow or the young of such species, poultry, rabbit, dog, cat, or any other animal, intending to use such animal for food purposes.

This section is applicable to any cult that kills (sacrifices) animals for any type of ritual, regardless of whether or not the flesh or blood of the animal is to be consumed; except that Kosher slaughtering is exempted from this ordinance.

Nothing in this ordinance is to be interpreted as prohibiting any licensed establishment from slaughtering for food purposes any animals which are specifically raised for food purposes.

Agents of the Chicago Commission on Animal Care and Control, police officers and humane investigators of any agency licensed by the City of Chicago and/or the Illinois Department of Agriculture for the prevention of cruelty to animals shall have the authority to confiscate any and all animals kept in violation of this ordinance. Enforcement personnel shall have the authority to enter any business premises during normal business hours where an animal or animals described in this ordinance are being housed or kept, but shall only enter domiciles or businesses during non-business hours after obtaining a proper search warrant or permission to enter from the occupant or owner of such premises.

Any person found to have been in violation of this Section shall be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for each offense. When a person keeps, owns or slaughters more than one animal in violation of this ordinance, the unlawful keeping, owning or slaughtering of each animal will be considered a separate offense for the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and due publication.

Amendment of Chapter 167.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 167 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by the insertion therein, in its proper numerical sequence, of a new section, in italics to be known as Section 167-5.1 and to read as follows:

167-5.1 All private scavengers shall be required to carry in each vehicle employed in the business of removing garbage, some means for the removal of excess or spilled garbage around or near waste containers.

Any person found in violation of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars for each offense.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.
