Call to Order.

On Wednesday, May 23, 1984 at 10:00 A.M. (the day and hour appointed for the meeting) Alderman Eugene Sawyer, President Pro Tem. called the City Council to order. Honorable Walter S. Quorum present.

Alderman Burke rose on a Point of Order, stating that under Article 13, Section 2 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, failure to file a Statement of Economic Interest requires forfeiture of office and that Harold Washington appeared to have forfeited the office of Mayor of the City of Chicago. Alderman Burke further stated that in view of the fact the office of Mayor was forfeit, state law provided that the Vice-Mayor of the City of Chicago was currently the Mayor.

Alderman Burke then moved that Vice-Mayor Richard Mell take the Chair and called for a roll call vote.

President Pro Tem. Sawyer ruled that in the absence of a motion to Suspend the Rules, Alderman Burke was Out of Order.

Alderman Burke then moved that the City Council do *Adjourn* until May 30, 1984 at 10:00 A.M. The motion *Prevailed* by yeas and nays as follows:
